	future facts	<i>Next year will be a leap year.</i>
<i>be going to + infinitive</i>	decision made at the time of speaking	<i>Oh, our guests are here. I'll sort out some drinks and nibbles.</i>
	prediction based on present evidence	<i>Kate Atkinson's new book has already sold thousands of copies; it's going to be a bestseller.</i>
	intention (personal or impersonal)	<i>Is the management going to accept the union's pay claim?</i>
present continuous	arrangements	<i>Next year we're working on a joint project with the Frankfurt office.</i>
	prediction of an action in progress	<i>By next July the economy will be growing at a healthy rate once more.</i>
future continuous: <i>will/won't be + -ing form</i>	plans made in the past	<i>I can't make next Monday's class as I'll be away from my long weekend away.</i>
	events that are part of a routine	<i>The committee will be meeting at the university on Friday.</i>
future perfect: <i>will/won't have + past participle</i>	prediction about a completed action in the future	<i>Will you have discussed this with your boss before you go to the conference?</i>
	an event that is part of a timetable	<i>The lecture starts tomorrow evening at 8 o'clock.</i>
present simple	after certain expressions of time, e.g. as soon as	<i>We will send you the books you ordered as soon as we receive payment.</i>
